Tour Highlights: Your time in Anchorage focuses on the Iditarod, Alaska's best-known sporting event. Meet four-time Iditarod Champion Martin Buser at his kennels. Witness the ceremonial start of the race in Anchorage and the official restart of the race in Willow, where you can cheer on your favorite mushers as they head off into Alaska's wilderness on this 1,049-mile journey to the finish line in Nome.

Day 1, Fri., Feb. 26: Chicago to Fairbanks. Welcome to Fairbanks! Join your Local Guide and traveling companions and get your first glimpse of one of nature's most magnificent shows-the colorful celestial arcs and waves of the aurora borealis (Northern Lights). When conditions are right, the aurora dances across the horizon and lights up the night sky, enchanting even Alaska's tough ol' "Sourdoughs" (old timers).

Day 2, Sat., Feb. 27: Fairbanks. Your morning is free to start exploring Fairbanks. Later this afternoon, enjoy a city tour of Fairbanks that includes a visit to the Morris Thompson Cultural Center. The train's wide windows are ideal for drinking in the stunning scenery on this full-day journey that truly showcases America's 49th state. Keep an eye out for views of Denali, as well as wildlife along the way. You will end the day in Anchorage, the capital of Alaska. (B,L)

Day 4, Mon., Mar. 1: Anchorage. Enjoy a full day at leisure in Anchorage. You may want to explore the historic downtown area or join in some of the festivities happening throughout the city, including a winter carnival, ice-sculpting contest, a melodrama, dog mushing, and more. Take a break at the Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center for the chance to see moose, musk ox, caribou, lynx, and even a porcupine up close. In coastal Seward, visit the Alaska Sealife Center for an in-depth look above and below the waters of Alaska. Day 9, Sat., Mar. 6: Anchorage-Ceremonial Start of the Iditarod. It's time for the main event! Head to 4th Avenue to get a great spot for the ceremonial start of the Iditarod. Before the race starts, there's a chance for photos and autographs with some of the mushers. Spend time cheering on mushers from all over the world, and enjoy other Iditarod festivities. Later, visit the Alaska Native Heritage Center, which shares the rich heritage of Alaska's 11 indigenous cultural groups. Tonight, reminisce over your Alaska winter adventure at a group dinner. (B,D)

Day 10, Sun., Mar. 7: Anchorage-Excursion to Willow-Race Restart. Travel north today to the quaint community of Willow, which started as a mining camp when gold was discovered in 1897. Here, you'll view the official restart of the Iditarod. Cheer for your favorite musher as they head off into the Alaska wilderness on this 1,049-mile journey to Nome and the finish line. Be sure to have your camera ready for this once-in-a-lifetime experience!

Day 11, Mon., Mar. 8: Anchorage. Your tour ends after breakfast this morning. With your included transfer, depart for the Anchorage airport and board your flight back to Chicago. (B)

I.D./Citizenship: Travelers must possess a valid photo i.d. with names matching those on their tour and flight reservations. Complete name, gender and birth date are required to confirm reservations per TSA/airline requirements.

Deposits and Payments: Please make checks payable to Burkhalter Tours. Most major credit cards are also accepted, although sometimes a cash discount may be offered. A deposit of **\$300 per person** is required to secure reservations. All tour confirmations are subject to receipt of signed tour application and payment verification. <u>Final payment is due by December 10, 2020.</u>

Cancellations/Refunds: All cancellations are subject to a \$50 Burkhalter Tours service fee that may not be covered by tour operator insurance. In addition to the service fee and possible airline penalties, tour cancellation penalties are as follows:

Cancel prior to December 10, 2020: Deposit is non-refundable

Cancel after December 10, 2020: Trip is non-refundable

No refund will apply on unused portions of the tour. If a roommate cancels, the remaining traveler may have to pay any single room supplement that is incurred. Name changes and departure date changes are considered reservation cancellations and are subject to cancellation fees. Once issued, airline tickets are 100% non-refundable.
