Day 1, Thu., Sep. 9: Depart the U.S. and travel to Amsterdam. Travel to O'Hare International Airport and board your overnight flight to Holland.

Rhine and Moselle - Page Two

Day 5, Mon., Sep. 13: Koblenz: Where the Rhine meets the Moselle River, you will find Koblenz. A visit to Koblenz would not be complete without a ride in a cable car. At just under 900 meters long, you will have a bird's eye view of the Upper Middle Rhine's World Heritage landscape and the mighty river itself on your way to the Ehrenbreitstein Fortress. And if you dare, one of the cable cars has a glass floor....imagine the view! (B,L,D)

Day 6, Tue., Sep. 14: Bernkastel. Today you can explore the charming wine village of Bernkastel with its half-timbered houses from the Middle Ages that are still standing. You can also grab walking sticks or a bike from the ship and explore the surrounding nature trails, or take a leisurely hike up the hills for breathtaking views of the Moselle. (B,L,D)

Day 7, Wed., Sep. 15: Remich. Today will be a fun day in Luxembourg! Explore the "Pearl of the Moselle," Remich is a picturesque town nestled amongst the vineyards. Wander along the charming old alleys and small squares and then enjoy a coffee or glass of wine on one of the beautiful terraces. (B,L,D)

Day 8, Thu., Sep. 16: Trier. Trier is Germany's oldest city with ancient remnants dating from 144-152 AD. You can experience the history on a Roman Trier Guided Tour to learn about the Roman civilization and visit the ruins of a 20,000-seat amphitheater and imperial baths. (B,L,D)

Day 9, Fri., Sep. 17: Cochem. There may not be a lovelier scene than Cochem, the town of half-timbered houses, scurrying streets and medieval gates nestled in the high, vine-clad slopes of the Moselle Valley. The crowning glory is Reichsburg Castle, originally built in the 12th century but then rebuilt in a fairytale style in the 1870s. (B,L,D)

Day 10, Sat., Sep. 18: Boppard, the Rhine Gorge and Rüdesheim. Today is action-packed if you want it to be. This morning, spend some free time enjoying Boppard or take in the beautiful surroundings on a bide ride or hike at your own pace. Next, enjoy the breathtaking views as you cruise through the spec-

tacular Rhine Gorge. This afternoon you will visit Rüdesheim. Take a hike through the vineyards, take an open-air cable car ride or tour the incredible Mechanical Music Museum for a one-of-a-kind instrumental experience.....the choice is yours! (B,L,D)

Day 11, Sun., Sep. 19: Ludwigshafen and Heidelberg. Have you wanted to see the "World's Largest Wine Barrel?" You can during a guided tour to Heidelberg Castle. Or you can enjoy a hide up Philsophers' Way for an inspiring view of the city below. (B,L,D)

Day 12, Mon., Sep. 20: Strasbourg. It is time to experience some French culture as you stop in Strasbourg, France. You can view the red-sandstone gothic cathedral with ancient murals or take a stroll through the lovely La Petite France district and take in the views along the peaceful waterfront promenade. You can join a tour to the magical Black Forest and experience the Vogtsbauernohf open-air-museum, or visit Badische Winzerkeller, the largest Germany wine producer and learn why this region is so great for wine-making. Complete name, gender and birth date are required to confirm reservations per TSA/airline requirements.

Deposits and Payments: Please make checks payable to Burkhalter Tours. Most major credit cards are also accepted. A deposit of \$300 per person is required to secure reservations. All tour confirmations are subject to receipt of signed tour application and payment verification. Final payment is due before June 4, 2021.

Cancellations/Refunds: All cancellations are subject to a \$50 Burkhalter Tours service fee that may not be covered by tour operator insurance. In addition to the service fee and possible airline penalties, tour cancellation penalties are as follows:

Cancel prior to June 4, 2021: Deposit is non-refundable

Cancel after June 4, 2021: Trip is non-refundable

No refund will apply on unused portions of the tour. If a roommate cancels, the remaining traveler may have to pay any single room supplement that is incurred. Name changes and departure date changes are considered reservation cancellations and are subject to cancellation fees. Once issued, airline tickets are 100% non-refundable.

Travel insurance: We strongly recommend the purchase of travel insurance to protect your investment and also to give you medical coverage in case of an emergency during the trip. Avalon Waterways offers a protection plan, but other plans are also available based on your needs. Most protection plans should be purchased at time of deposit. Ask your agent for more information.

Tour Conditions: This tour is a regular Avalon departure and no minimum number of Burkhalter travelers is required for the tour to operate. All arrangements are based upon tariffs in effect on date of brochure production and are subject to change. Once deposit has been received, any changes to air or land arrangements may be assessed a \$50 revision fee. Revision fees may be higher once air is ticketed. Itinerary is subject to change by the tour operator.

Air Transportation: The airfare portion of the tour price is subject to change until ticketed. Group airfares may require a minimum of 10 travelers. Airline schedules and routing are subject to change by the airlines at any time. Group seat assignments are usually done by the airline, and changes are subject to availability, which may be limited. If specific seat assignments are vital to your enjoyment of the tour, we recommend individual air reservations rather than booking with the group. Airline seat assignments may only be requested after final payment and may be limited in availability.
